 Plastic bottles take 700 to 1000 years to biodegrade.¹

- 80% of plastic bottles are not recycled.²
 - Tap water is just as safe as bottled water.³ Bottled water companies do not have to release their water-testing results to the public, whereas municipalities do⁴
- Terephthalate (PET) is the most commonly used plastic for making water bottles. PET is derived from crude oil.

Considering the number of people attending the Masjid during Ramadan at night and using bottled water including during lftar, it can be estimated that on average the consumption of disposable plastic bottles of water per day is in the **hundreds** which adds up to **tens of thousands of bottles of water** for the whole month of Ramadan.

- Bottled water is thousands of times more expensive than water from your faucet.
 - The World Wide Fund for Nature campaigns strongly that bottled water is not only environmentally unfriendly but also a waste of consumers money¹
